OGDEN ORDNANCE PLANT, UTAH

Ogden Ordnance Plant is located in Davis and Weber Counties, Utah, and comprises of 3,509 acres of land of which 3,489 acres were acquired in fee. The plant was used for production of military ordnances, during the war. The entire installation was transferred to the Department of the Air Force by direction of the Chief of Staff, U.S. Army, dated November 29, 1954. Accountability for the land, buildings and improvements was accepted by the Commander, Hill Air Force Base effective 31 Mar 1955. The property is still controlled by Hill Air Force Base as of this date
