SITE NAME: Durant Park Maneuver Area.

LOCATION: The site is located in the City of Oakland, Alameda County, CA (Figure 1).

SITE HISTORY: Durant Park Maneuver Area was established by the Army to provide a campsite or bivouac area for troops. The War Department acquired 2.319 acres by permits dated 29 May 1943. There is no information regarding the improvements made at the site.

The permits were terminated on 5 August 1944. There is no information regarding restoration provisions.

Currently, the western part of the site is occupied by the Grass Valley Elementary School, which was constructed in the 1950's. The eastern half of the site is a residential neighborhood.

SITE VISIT: The site was visited by Mr. Brad Call and Mr. John Hoge of the Corps of Engineers, Sacramento District, on 14 December 1990. Inspection of the area revealed no evidence of HTW contamination. A discussion was held with the school principal, Ms. Donna Wilson, as well as the school custodian. They are both unaware of any contamination at the school now or in the past. Additionally, Mr. Hoge contacted Mr. Dennis Byrne of the Alameda County Health Department, Hazardous Materials Division. He stated that the county is unaware of any HTW contamination at the subject site.

CATEGORY OF HAZARDS: This site is classified as NOFA.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On 29 May 1943, the War Department acquired 2.319 acres by permit for the purpose of establishing the Durant Park Maneuver Area. There is no information regarding the improvements made at this site.
2. The site was used as a bivouac area or campsite.
3. The permit was terminated on 5 August 1944. There is no information regarding restoration provisions.

DETERMINATION

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the site has been determined to be formerly used by Department of Defense. It is therefore eligible for the Defense Environmental Restoration Program - Formerly Used Defense Sites established under 10 U.S.C. 2701 et seq.

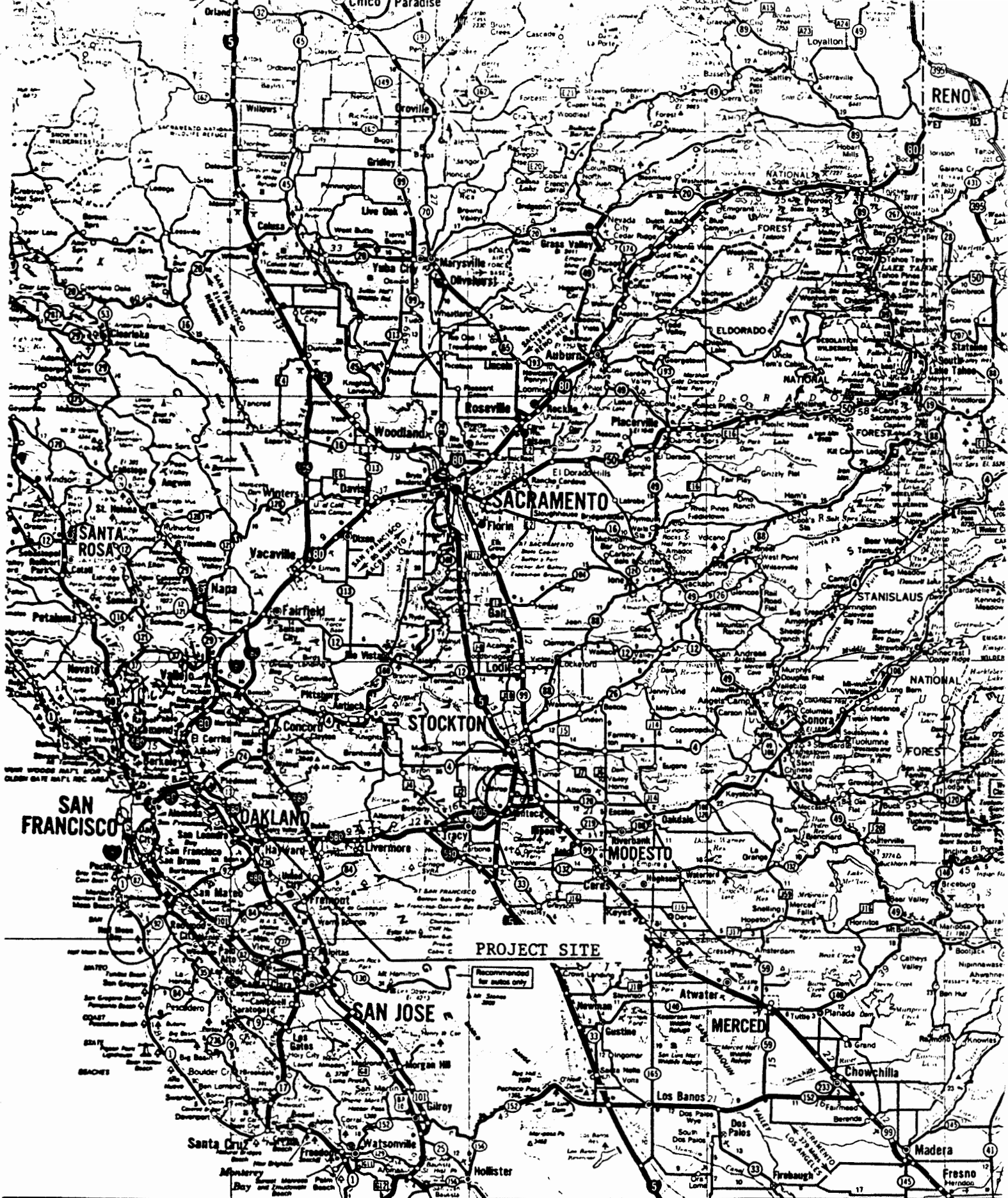
