The Utah Department of Environmental Quality, Division of Environmental Response and Remediation (DERR) has reviewed the NDAI close out letter for the following Formerly Used Defense Site (FUDS):

- **J08UT0057 Abandoned Gravel Pit**


Based upon our evaluation of the current information, DERR concurs with the Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE) that an NDAI designation is appropriate for this site. If DERR or ACOE becomes aware of releases or threatened releases of hazardous substances, hazardous waste, pollutants or contaminants at this site, and there is good reason to believe that the contamination is a result of past Department of Defense practices, then we would expect the ACOE to investigate and reevaluate the site as part of its obligation and responsibility under the FUDS program.
